

The course of Japanese linguistics in April, 2003 to March, 2004 develops a grammar of Japanese on the parser Earley. The scope of the grammar is the case forms (nominative, accusative, and locative), postpositions, the topic form, the form of the polite style, tense (perfective, and non-perfective), verb bases, passive, and relative clauses of Japanese.
